Don't empty your black tank until it is at least 2/3 full and if you have a black tank flush be sure to use it. Always empty your black tank first. Time to Travel went to Twin Falls and toured the Jerome cheese factory "Agropur" It is owned by Canadian companies; all the milk comes from dairies within 50 miles of the plant. If your shoes laces
